Midwest Energy Companies Pledge to Build Nation's Largest Interstate Electric Vehicle Charging Network

Electric vehicle (EV) owners will soon be taking road trips across the Midwest with increased confidence. That's because six regional energy companies, including Ameren Illinois and Ameren Missouri, have signed a first-of-its-kind Memorandum of Cooperation, committing to work together to build a vast network of Midwest EV charging stations by the end of 2022.

According to the Edison Electric Institute, there are more than 1.5 million electric vehicles on U.S. roads today. By 2030, that number is expected to grow to 18.7 million. To support EVs by that time, 9.6 million public charging stations will be needed; only about 100,000 are available today.

"Ameren Illinois has been implementing a modernization plan to prepare the grid for the increased customer demand for cleaner energy, including electric vehicles," says Ameren Illinois Chairman & President Richard Mark. "Our focus in joining this multi-state coalition is to develop a charging infrastructure that will help reduce 'range anxiety' and lead to broader adoption of electric vehicles."

NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE RECOGNIZES AMEREN ILLINOIS FOR SAFETY AND STORM PREPAREDNESS

Ameren Illinois goes to great lengths to proactively prepare for hazardous weather. The first step in that process is to gain a detailed understanding of where and when storms will impact our 43,700-square-mile service territory. Being weather-ready enables us to reduce the impact of outages on our 1.2 million customers.

In recognition of our commitment to safety and weather preparedness, the National Weather Service (NWS) has named Ameren Illinois a Weather-Ready Nation "Ambassador of Excellence."

Each year, representatives from the NWS review the 11,000-plus Weather-Ready Nation Ambassadors – government, non-profit, education, and private enterprises who commit to help improve the nation's readiness against extreme weather and climate events. Fewer than 100 organizations are accorded the "Excellence" distinction for exceptional performance.

Ameren Illinois fortifies power grid in Forsyth

To enhance energy reliability and resiliency for customers in Forsyth and surrounding communities, Ameren Illinois has added new equipment and expanded the footprint of its County Highway 20 Substation. New, large-scale circuit breakers inside the substation will allow Ameren Illinois to re-route power to customers from other sources if an outage should occur.

This \$7.5 million project is another key step in our long-range plans to construct a more robust electric grid to meet our customers' growing needs. Since 2012, Ameren Illinois has implemented hundreds of projects, adding new technology and strengthening poles, wires and distribution equipment. As a result, reliability has improved by an average of 17 percent and the average duration of an outage has been reduced by 19 percent.

Natural gas upgrades in Alton, Peoria County boost system reliability

Ameren Illinois is committed to delivering the safe, reliable natural gas you need to stay warm this winter. We are implementing hundreds of projects across Downstate Illinois to enhance the safety, integrity and reliability of our natural gas system.

We recently invested \$1.3 million to install new equipment at an Alton gate station – the point where natural gas is received from interstate pipelines and transferred into the local distribution system for safe delivery to customer homes and businesses. The upgrades include adding a new pressure control station, over-pressure protection equipment, remote monitoring equipment and odorization equipment.

Meanwhile, customers in Peoria County are benefitting from a \$21 million project that upgraded a 3.2-mile stretch of natural gas transmission pipeline south of Bartonville. Crews replaced 1960s vintage pipeline with modern 24-inch steel pipeline along the route. The new pipeline will strengthen the integrity and reliability of the company's natural gas system and support economic development for all of Peoria County.
