# "BRIGHTEN THE BLOCK" PROMOTES SAFETY & SUSTAINABILITY

April 22 is Earth Day, and our "Brighten the Block" initiative is one way Ameren Illinois helps protect the planet. Now in its third year, Brighten the Block brings together Ameren Illinois and community volunteers to replace standard incandescent lightbulbs with LED bulbs on the front porches of homes across our service territory. LED bulbs are brighter, use less energy and last longer. That means customers can light up the night for less.



## **System upgrades continue in 2019** *Reliability up, rates down*

Today's electric customers are plugged in like never before — and that means reliable energy has never been more important. In 2019, Ameren Illinois continues the next phase of our plan to upgrade the state's electric delivery infrastructure. Ongoing improvements include:

- Fortifying and storm-hardening poles and wires
- Installing new technology that can detect power outages and switch to an alternative power source
- Adding smart meters at more than 1 million customer locations

As a result of these improvements, reliability has improved significantly. Customers are experiencing fewer outages each year — and when outages do occur, we're restoring the power 19 percent faster.

As reliability has improved, electric rates have dropped. Customers are paying less in 2019 for electric service than they paid in 2012 when the smart grid law took effect. The electric rates paid by our residential customers are nearly 20 percent below the national average.

#### DIAL 8-1-1 BEFORE YOU DIG

Eager to start those outdoor projects? If your spring to-do list involves digging, be sure to dial 811 before the shovel hits the dirt.

This call to JULIE (Joint Utility Locating Information for Excavators) will ensure that all buried utility-owned lines are marked so you can dig safely. If you don't call and you hit an underground utility line, you could be hurt or killed. You could also disrupt service to an entire neighborhood and possibly be held liable for damages.

Regardless of the size of your project, call JULIE (or submit an electronic request at **Illinois1Call.com**) at least 48 hours before you dig. The service is free, and it's the law.
